PHD Family Welfare Foundation organized its 9th Women Astitva Samman and 8th Junior Astitva Samman 2024 on February 9, 2024. The inaugural lamp was lit by the Chief Guest Hon'ble Ms. Justice Rekha Palli, Judge, High Court of Delhi, Shri Gopal Jiwarajka, Former President, PHDCCI, Shri Suman Jyoti Khaitan, Former President, PHDCCI and Ms Anuradha Goel, Chairperson, PHDFWF. The 9th Women Astitva Samman were given to Tata Consultancy Services in the Corporate category, Prayas Trust, Women Led Social Arm of L&T in CSR category, Indo-Tibetan Border Police in the government category, Womennovator in the MSME category, Aarohi in the NGO category and Dr. Smriti Singh in the special category. The 8th Junior Astitva Samman was given to Modern School, Vasant Vihar and Shiv Nadar school, Faridabad. PHDFWF organized a health checkup camp in Kota, Rajasthan

The camp focused on general health, eye and dental health. Four doctors from PHDFWF, including General Physician, Gynecologist, Dentist and Ophthalmologist were present for the camp. PHDFWF provided free medical service and free medicines to more than 3000 beneficiaries in Kota, underscoring its commitment to improving healthcare access and promoting well-being in communities.

RCDP marks a significant milestone in our efforts to address menstrual hygiene challenges among

women and girls in our community fostering a sense of confidence and well-being among them as they pursue their educational and vocational goals.

EDUCATION



The PHD Family Welfare Foundation is actively engaged in promoting education by offering free remedial classes at six sites and computer training programs at 20 centers across Delhi-NCR, Gujarat, and Rajasthan. This initiative aims to enhance educational opportunities and computer literacy in these regions, emphasizing the foundation's commitment to empowering communities through readily available learning opportunities.

HEALTH CARE

The PHD Family Welfare Foundation operates ten fully equipped mobile medical vans to provide



preventive, clinical, and diagnostic healthcare services directly to needy villages and resettlement colonies in Delhi-NCR, Rajasthan, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, and Gujarat. These mobile units offer immediate diagnostic services such as blood hemoglobin, blood grouping, and blood pressure checks, along with free outpatient services for disadvantaged individuals. The primary objective is to raise awareness and promote appropriate healthcare-seeking behavior, particularly among women and children

Additionally, eye and dental mobile medical vans reach remote areas with limited access to such services, offering eye checkups, scaling, temporary refilling, and free outpatient care. Both general and specialized medical vans distribute medications and spectacles to patients daily. As of January 2024, PHDFWF's mobile medical vans have served approximately sixteen lakhs twenty-one thousand two hundred and five individuals. This outreach is made possible through the support of funding agencies like Jaquar Foundation, Imperial Auto Industries Ltd, Seth Madanlall Palriwala Foundation, Rotary Club of Delhi Premier, Sanganeria Foundation for Health and Education Trust, and AAOT.
