MAJOR PROGRAMME

INTRODUCTION

The PHD Family Welfare Foundation (PHDFWF) a registered non-profit organization has been promoted by the PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry thirty-seven years ago. PHDFWF has been registered as a Trust under the Indian Trust Act, 1882, 80G of the IT Act, 1961 and the FCRA. The Foundation has primarily concentrated on implementing integrated health & family welfare projects in the field of high-risk groups for STD/HIV/AIDS in resettlement colonies, skill development & income generation training for needy women and youth, mobile medical care, care for people living with disabilities, educational courses, personality development classes and self-defense training for girls PAN India. At present, PHDFWF is running 10 mobile medical vans and 24 skill development centers in states like Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, Rajasthan, Gujarat, Assam and Odisha. All these training programmes are being carried out free of charge.

New Center opened in Katwaria Sarai

In December 2023, the PHD Family Welfare Foundation (PHDFWF) started a new center in Katwaria Sarai with the financial support from Jaquar Foundation and Electronics Mart India Ltd. This center offer courses including computer training, beauty culture, english speaking and tailoring & embroidery. This collaborative initiative not only marks a commendable effort in fostering education and vocational skills but also reflects the commitment of these organizations towards contributing to the holistic development of the community.





During a recent visit by officials from L&T Prayas Trust, the Meethapur Skill Center and Okhla Center underwent a comprehensive review. The feedback from the visit was highly positive, with the L&T officials expressing satisfaction with the overall environment of both the centers. At the Okhla Center, they observed commendable progress in the beneficiaries' results compared to their status prior to joining the center. Additionally, the officials were impressed with the Meethapur Center, acknowledging the high quality of all the courses offered. The L&T Prayas Trust officials conveyed their happiness with the significant progress made by both centers, affirming the positive impact of their initiatives on the individuals undergoing skill development programs.

SKILL DEVELOPMENT & VOCATIONAL TRAINING

The foundation is committed to addressing the unique needs of each community, vocational training, and skill development initiatives with support from its funding agencies like SMPF, Jaquar Foundation, Hindustan Tin Works, Kajaria Ceramics, L&T Prayas Trust, MG Goyal Gases and many more. Through these efforts, PHDFWF is not only providing and training but also creating opportunities for underprivileged women and youth to enhance their lives by making them self-reliant to support their families as well as contribute meaningfully to society. Since inception till November 2024, PHDFWF has already benefitted approximately fifty thousand beneficiaries. The collaboration with diverse organizations reflects a collective commitment to social

welfare and community development. PHDFWF's skill development centers stand as beacons of hope, fostering growth and empowerment in communities across the country.



HEALTH CARE

PHD Family Welfare Foundation has been running ten well-equipped mobile medical vans to provide preventive, clinical, diagnostic medical care to the poor villages and in resettlement colonies at their doorstep in Delhi-NCR, Rajasthan, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh and Gujarat.

GENERAL MOBILE MEDICAL VANS



Eight Mobile Medical Vans of PHDFWF provide on the spot diagnostic facilities like blood sugar, hemoglobin, blood grouping, blood pressure etc with free OPD services to the underprivileged. The purpose is also to inculcate in them awareness and proper behaviour to seek treatment for their ailments particularly the women and children.

EYE AND DENTAL MOBILE MEDICAL VANS



Two eye and dental mobile medical vans goes to such remote areas and resettlement colonies where people have hardly experienced these free facilities with eye checkup, scaling and temporary refilling etc. with free OPD services. PHDFWF distributes spectacles to the needy patients on daily basis apart from free medicines.

Till November,2024 PHDFWF through its mobile medical vans have benefitted approximately sixteen lakhs twenty-one thousand two hundred and five with support from funding agencies like Jaquar Foundation, Imperial Auto Industries Ltd, Seth Madanlall Palriwala Foundation, Rotary club of Delhi Premier and Sanganeria foundation for Health and Education Trust and AAOT.

PHDFWF-TARGET INTERVENTION PROJECT ON HIV/AIDS

Since 2003, PHDFWF has been providing healthcare and Reproductive and Child Health (RCH) services to High-Risk Groups (HRGs) and migrant workers residing in resettlement areas of Okhla through the Target Intervention Project (TI), supported by the Delhi State AIDS Control Society (DSACS), Government of NCT Delhi.

EDUCATION

PHDFWF is actively contributing to education by offering free remedial classes in six centers and computer training courses in 20 centers across Delhi-NCR, Gujarat, and Rajasthan. This initiative aims to enhance educational opportunities and computer literacy in these regions, emphasizing the foundation's commitment to empowering communities through accessible learning programs.
