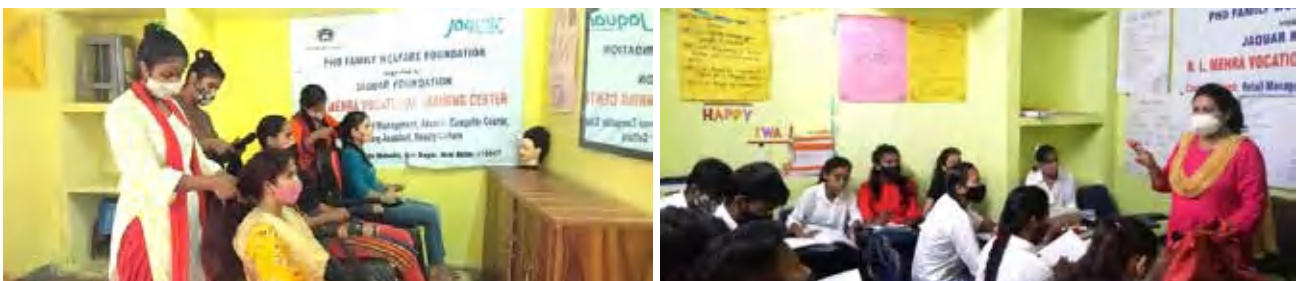

PHDFWF-JAQUAR N.L. MEHRA VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTRE, AYA NAGAR



PHDFWF-NL Mehra Vocational Training Centre was started in the month of August 2020 at Aya Nagar. This project is being supported by Jaquar Foundation. Vocational courses like nursing assistant, computer

education, beauty culture & retail and management are being conducted. From the month of August 2021, PHDFWF has started an electrician course which will benefit many beneficiaries from the area by providing them better

training which can help the them with good exposure and job probability that can lead to better livelihood. Till August 2021, 200 beneficiaries got the opportunity to learn and received certification from PHDFWF.

PHDFWF-KAJARIA CERAMICS SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING CENTRE, ASSAM



PHDFWF – KAJARIA Skill Development Centre was started in May'2018 in Assam. Rural women are getting free training on hand weaving & knitting along with training in local craft. Presently, local beneficiaries are learning the skills to make mekhela chaddar and gamusa. More than 450 trainees

have received training from this centre. This will help women in earning an extra source of income and become self-employed.

HINDUSTAN TIN WORKS SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING CENTRE, BADARPUR



PHDFWF-Hindustan Tin Works Skill Centre was implemented in May 2018 and it is situated at Lal Kuan, Badarpur. This Centre is offering free training in computer education and beauty culture. From this initiative more than 850 trainees have been certified and

currently 75 trainees are enrolled in this centre.

PHDFWF - JAQUAR SKILL DEVELOPMENT CENTRE IN MATALWAS & NARAYAN VIHAR



PHDFWF started its skill development training centre in Rajasthan in Matalwas (April'21) and Narayan Vihar (July'21). These centres are offering courses in tailoring & embroidery, beauty culture, adult education & tuitions for maths and science.

Around 200 students have already enrolled in different vocational courses in both the centers.

L&T HOWDEN PVT. LTD. SKILL DEVELOPMENT CENTRE, PALLA, FARIDABAD



PHDFWF-L&T Howden Pvt. Ltd. has established this centre in the month of September 2021. This skill development centre offered

courses in tailoring & embroidery, beauty culture and computer training to young women & girls. This centre was active from

September 2020 to July 2021. A total of 275 local women and girls have availed training in their respective courses.

MG GOYAL GASES SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING CENTRE, BADLI EXTN, ROHINI



PHDFWF has implemented a skill development project in Badli Extn., Rohini. This project has been active from 2017 with the support from Goyal MG Gases.

Presently, 115 students have enrolled in the current batch and around 1850 beneficiaries have already passed and some have taken their skill as a profession.

Even during the lockdown, classes were conducted on online platform which were very successful.

PHDFWF-JAWAHAR FOUNDATION HEALTH CARE ATTENDANT

With the support of Jawahar Foundation, PHDFWF is providing training in health care attendant course in Bhilwara, Rajasthan. Presently, more than 30 trainees are attaining this free course under the project. This centre was established in February 2021 in the presence of FWF officials and Jawahar Foundation.



PHDFWF-SMPF SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING CENTRE, DWARKAPURI

PHDFWF-SMPF is the first skill development centre of PHDFWF. This centre has been providing training in tailoring & embroidery, beauty culture & mehandi, mobile repairing and computer education. This centre is situated at Dwarkapuri and provided access to skill training to more than 5000 trainees. Currently, 132 students are availing training at the centre.



L&T PRAYAS SKILL DEVELOPMENT CENTRE, FARIDABAD



PHDFWF Family Welfare Foundation with support from Prayas Trust, L&T Faridabad is providing vocational course of tailoring & embroidery to young girls and household women of Surya Vihar and other nearby areas. This centre was started in August 2020. This course provided training to more than 119 beneficiaries from Surya Vihar and nearby areas.

PHDFWF-JAQUAR SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING CENTRES, MANDI VILLAGE



PHDFWF – Jaquar Mandi centre was started in 2018. This centre is offering vocational course like tailoring & embroidery, beauty culture, cooking and mobile repairing. This centre has offered training to young boys and girls, household women to empower themselves and also acquire a job with this training. This centre has completed 3 batches and certified more than 290 beneficiaries. The classes were running online due to the lockdown and was very successful in terms of imparting knowledge.

PHDFWF-WRG SKILL DEVELOPMENT CENTRE, AYA NAGAR



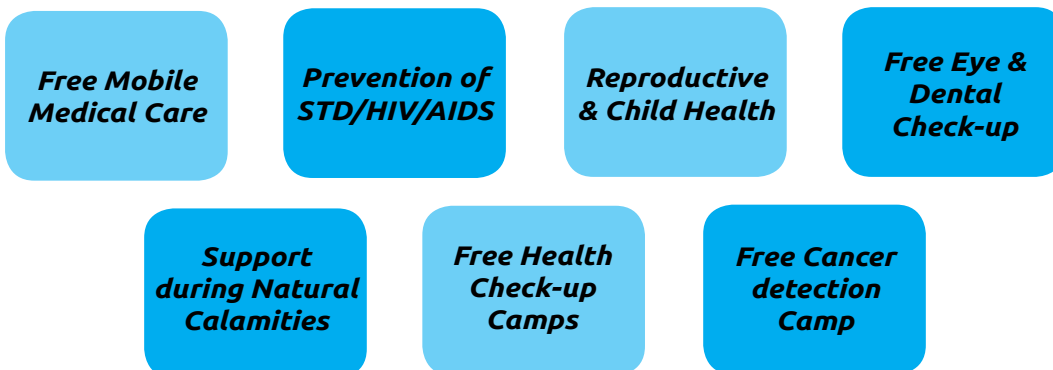
PHDFWF-WRG started their centre at Aya Nagar by providing training in computer education and tailoring & embroidery. Currently, 140 beneficiaries have already enrolled in this course.

PHDFWF - FENA SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING CENTRE

PHDFWF-FENA skill development centre in association with Fena Foundation was started on January 2015 in Okhla phase 1, Tekhand colony and successfully trained more than 1800 beneficiaries in tailoring and embroidery. Currently, 38 trainees are being trained in tailoring & embroidery course.

PHD Family Welfare Foundation virtually inaugurated its 6th Mobile Medical Van on August 24, 2021 donated by the Rotary Club of Delhi Premier and supported by Jaquar Foundation. The Mobile Medical Van was inaugurated by Mr. Saurabh Sanyal, Secretary General, PHD House and was virtually inaugurated in the presence of Presidium, PHD Chamber; Dr Rajendra K.

Somany & Mr. Alok Shriram, Former Presidents, PHDCCI; Ms. Anuradha Goel, Chairperson, PHDFWF; Ms. Rashmi Singh I.A.S, Director, Department of WCD; Ms.. Anesha Dalmia, Immediate Past President, Rotary Club of Premier; Mr. Kanwar Shamsher, CSR Head, Jaquar Foundation; Ms.. Madhulika Mehta, Co-chairperson and Ms. Karuna Shriram Co-chairperson, WC

Committee. This is the 6th Mobile Medical van of PHDFWF which will be dedicatedly used for health check-up camps for street & abandoned children residing in 101 child care institutions and orphanages being run by the Department of Women & Child Development, Govt. of NCT of Delhi.

PHDFWF-JAQUAR FOUNDATION MOBILE MEDICAL VAN (GURUGRAM, HARYANA)



PHD Family Welfare Foundation with financial assistance from Jaquar Foundation is providing healthcare facilities to the needy at their door steps since 2018. The health check-up camps are being organized in Alipur,

Garhi Bazidpur, Harchandpur and Dhaula villages of Haryana adopted by the Jaquar Group. In the first and second wave of COVID pandemic, regular health camps along with awareness sessions and other health related

sensitization programs were conducted adhering to strict COVID safety protocols. A total of 157 health camps and 9509 patients benefitted from these camps.

PHDFWF - JAQUAR FOUNDATION MOBILE MEDICAL VAN, (BHIWADI, RAJASTHAN)



PHDFWF is implementing a mobile medical van project with financial support from Jaquar Foundation in Bhiwadi, Rajasthan. During this year, 181 camps were conducted in various villages adopted by Jaquar group in Bhiwadi. Free diagnostic care, clinical services along with free medicines were provided to the patients. A total of 9000 patients benefited from these camps.

PHDFWF - SETH MADANLALL PALRIWALA FOUNDATION MOBILE MEDICAL VAN

PHDFWF has been implementing SMPF-PHDFWF mobile van for the past 23 years with financial support from Seth Madanlall Palriwala Foundation. A total of 104 free health check-up camps were conducted in different rural areas of Haryana, Uttar Pradesh and various resettlement colonies of Delhi/ NCR benefitting 5169 patients. Free diagnostic care, clinical services and medicines were



provided to the patients. Moreover, routine awareness sessions were also conducted for the patients.

PHDFWF-L&T HOWDEN MOBILE MEDICAL CAMP, FARIDABAD



PHDFWF with support from L&T Howden conducted various health check-up camps in different parts of Faridabad. A total of 32 health check-up camps were conducted from October 2020 to March 2021. A total of 3022 Patients received free health check-up services and medicines as prescribed by the doctors.

PHDFWF - ARUNA ABHEY OSWAL TRUST - MOBILE MEDICAL VAN

PHDFWF is running a mobile medical van in association with Holy Family Hospital donated by Aruna Abhey Oswal Trust. Free health check-up camps were organized in Okhla resettlement colonies, Priyanka Camp, Chesair Home, Ali Village, Subash Camp and Taimoor Nagar, Nai Basti. In total, 5151 patients benefitted from these camps



PHDFWF-JAQUAR FOUNDATION DENTAL & EYE MOBILE MEDICAL VAN



PHDFWF organized 58 general health camps in the month of October'2020 to March 2021. A total of 31 Eye & 29 dental check-up camps were conducted in the months of January 2021 to March 2021 in different resettlement areas of Delhi/NCR and different villages of Gurugram adopted by the Jaquar Group. Free eye and dental check-up, dental screening, scaling & filling, distribution of medicines was done on 3718 patients during this period. Post March 2021, Mobile van was being used for conducting health check-up camps in 101 Childcare institutions and other activities. More than 30 camps have been conducted so far benefiting more than 1500 children.

PHDFWF-DSACS TARGET INTERVENTION PROJECT ON HIV/AIDS



The Target Intervention Project (TI) has been providing various Health/RCH Services to industrial and migrant workers with the financial support from Delhi State AIDS Control Society (DSACS) since 2003 in resettlement areas of Okhla. During this year, 1616 ICTC, 1477 RPR, 2303 RMC, 259 PT, 57 STI, 22 DIC, 40 Group meetings, 27 review meetings, 150 syphilis, 375 clinical foot fall were conducted under the program. During the second wave of COVID-19, interaction with local communities, review meetings with network operators were being conducted by DSACS & PHDFWF officials through virtual sessions to supervise daily activities, regular counselling etc. Counselling of STD patients, HRGs are being done through teleconference by the doctors on a regular basis.
