Savita Thakur, Hon'ble Minister of State, Women & Child Development, GOI was the Chief Guest and Lt Gen Vinod Khandare (retd.) PVMS. AVSM, SM, Principal Adviser (USC), Dept . of Defence, GOI was the Guest of Honour* of the programme. Hon'ble Smt. Savitri Thakur appreciated initiatives like Astitva Samman awards as it gives strength to organisations and school students and motivates individuals to do even better which will continue to progress towards an Atmanirbhar Bharat and a Viksit Bharat.

The 10th Astitva Samman recognised the *National Handloom Development Corporation* under Government category for empowering women in the handloom sector, *Jaipur Rugs* under MSME category supporting over 40,000 artisans, 85% of whom are women, *The Lalit Suri Hospitality Group* under Corporate category for its commitment to women in leadership roles, the *Mobius Foundation* under NGO category for empowering over 9,000 girls and 25,000 women in rural India, and *Tinka Samajik Sanstha* under Special category (Sports) for its impactful work with 76,264 children and youth.
