PHDFWF - ROTARY CLUB OF DELHI PREMIER ORGANISED HEALTH CAMP IN INDIRA VIHAR/SANJAY COLONY, OKHLA, DELHI



On 27th August 2026, PHDFWF with the generous support of Rotary Club of Delhi Premier, District 3011, organized a General Health Check-up Camp in Indira Vihar/Sanjay Colony, Okhla Phase 2, Delhi with the objective of providing accessible and quality healthcare services to the local community. A total of 119 patients benefited from the camp and received free medical consultation, basic health screenings and free medicines. The camp was beneficial during the ongoing flu season, when a significant number of patients reported symptoms such as cough, cold, fever, weakness and other seasonal ailments. Free basic diagnostic screenings such as blood pressure and blood sugar testing were also conducted.

PHD Family Welfare Foundation is making a significant impact on communities by running 34 skill development centers, Pan India. These centers play a crucial role in providing essential free skills to empower the marginalised youth & women.

Through these efforts, PHDFWF is creating opportunities for underprivileged women and youth to enhance their lives by making them self-reliant to support their families as well as contribute meaningfully to society.

HEALTH CARE

The primary objective of healthcare projects is to provide medical care to the local communities in underserved areas. These MMV projects are specifically designed to reach communities that have limited access to healthcare services due to factors such as geographical location, poverty, or lack of infrastructure. Target Intervention project under the foundation specially looking after high-risk groups for prevention of HIV/AIDS.

Currently, PHDFWF is providing healthcare services through its 12 mobile medical vans including eye and dental mobile medical vans and TI project in Delhi-NCR, Rajasthan, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, and Gujarat with the financial support from different funding agencies.
